**Re: Case No. 23-\_\_\_\_-TF – Tariff filing of Green Mountain Power Corporation for approval of its FY24 Annual Base Rate, October 1, 2023 to September 30, 2024**

Dear Ms. Anderson:

Green Mountain Power (GMP) is filing its Annual Base Rate Tariff Filing for Fiscal Year 2024 (FY24) pursuant to GMP's Multi-Year Regulation Plan (MYRP or the Plan), approved by the Public Utility Commission (PUC or the Commission) in Case No. 21-3707-PET on August 31, 2022, and as amended in Case No. 23-0141-PET on March 30, 2023.

As outlined in the attached supporting material, GMP is requesting a rate change of 5.29% for FY24. Schedule A to the enclosed materials summarizes the filing.

GMP encloses clean and redlined versions of its tariffs and the supporting cost of service schedules. A proposed customer notice is also enclosed for PUC review and approval. GMP would like to start the notice process as soon as possible. GMP's biannual public forum will take place on July 19, 2023, and will be publicized through various channels, including this notice on energy statements once the language is finalized and has received PUC approval. Given recent observed delays in mail delivery, GMP estimates it will take five to six weeks for all customers to receive this notice in their energy statements, and therefore respectfully requests PUC approval no later than the week of June 5<sup>th</sup>.

The Plan provides for a sixty-day review period for the Department of Public Service (Department). As required by the Plan, GMP previously provided power supply and revenue forecast information to the Department on May 1, 2023 to facilitate its review. GMP is also providing an electronic copy of this filing and all supporting materials in original format to the PUC and the Department. As set forth in the Plan, GMP respectfully requests that the Commission authorize the proposed rate change by September 1, 2021—thirty days before the October 1, 2021 effective date of the revised tariffs.
