**Re: Case No. 25-\_\_\_\_-PET – Petition of Green Mountain Power for approval of its new multi-year regulation plan pursuant to 30 V.S.A. §§ 108, 209, 218, and 218d**

Dear Ms. Anderson:

On behalf of Green Mountain Power (“GMP”), enclosed is GMP’s proposed 2027 Multi-Year Regulation Plan (“New Plan”) to establish the process under which GMP’s rates and services will be set beginning October 1, 2026. This New Plan meets the criteria of 30 V.S.A. § 218d and carries forward the general framework of GMP’s current regulation plan. It is designed to respond to the changing energy landscape and to enable GMP to continue to offer energy programs to benefit customers, while providing reliable, safe, low-cost, low-carbon power through a more reliable, resilient, and modern grid. We look forward to the Commission’s and Department of Public Service’s review of this New Plan over the coming months.

The New Plan is supported by a Petition, and the prefiled testimony and exhibits of Michael Burke; Laura Doane and Rob Bingel; Maria Fischer; and Josh Castonguay, along with a Notice of Appearance.

We also enclose a customer bill notice that will be sent after the Commission approves its language and sets the dates for a public hearing for this filing. We will work with Commission staff and the Department to coordinate a date and time for that hearing, which should occur a full billing cycle after sending notices in order to reach all customer energy statements in advance.

Under 30 V.S.A. § 218d(f), review of the New Plan shall be completed within twelve months. GMP is therefore seeking Commission approval of the New Plan no later than September 1, 2026, so that the New Plan and GMP’s FY27 rates can go into effect October 1, 2026. We will work with the Department on a proposed schedule for this proceeding, which will seek to coordinate ongoing review of the New Plan with review of GMP’s upcoming Fiscal Year 2027 cost-of-service rate case, anticipated to be filed January 16, 2026. We will file a proposed schedule following further discussion with the Department.
