## **PROPOSED BILL NOTICE LANGUAGE:**

Green Mountain Power recently filed a request with the Vermont Public Utility Commission (PUC) for approval of a new multi-year regulation plan (Plan). The Plan sets the process for PUC regulation of GMP's rates over four years, from October 1, 2026, through September 30, 2030. The Plan continues much of the framework of GMP's current regulation plan including among other things: establishing requirements for GMP's project investments on behalf of customers; continuing adjustors to reflect changes in power costs and major storm events; and continuing performance metrics in service quality, reliability, and energy innovation.
