

## Customer Notice

Green Mountain Power (GMP) recently filed a request with the Vermont Public Utility Commission (PUC) for approval of a new multi-year regulation plan (Proposed Plan). The Proposed Plan sets the process for PUC regulation of GMP's rates over four years, from October 1, 2026, through September 30, 2030. The Proposed Plan continues much of the framework of GMP's current multi-year regulation plan including among other things: requirements for GMP's capital investments, adjustors to reflect changes in power costs and major storm events (this is called the Current Energy and Major Storm Adjustor line-item charge on bills), the earnings sharing adjustment mechanism, and performance metrics for service quality, reliability, and energy innovation.

The PUC will hold a public hearing to provide an opportunity for public comments on the Proposed Plan remotely on December 11, 2025 at 7:00 P.M., with an information session hosted by the Vermont Department of Public Service occurring prior to it at 6:30 P.M.
